


With no fence separating this private game reserve from the Kruger National Park, big game – and yes, that includes the Big Five – are free to pass through. Wild is woven into every moment at Sabi Sabi: sip your morning coffee while a herd of elephants drink from a watering hole nearby. Watch lions catch an afternoon nap. Spot hyenas slinking through the darkness. Soak in a tub with views of the Bushveld, and dine on local eats under the stars.

## Cottar's Safaris, Kenya

Tucked between Kenya's Maasai Mara and Tanzania's Serengeti National Park, the sole safari camp in Olderkesi Conservancy offers tourists the chance to contribute to conservation and witness the Great Migration – without the crowds. ## Churchill Wild Manitoba, Canada



The side effects of embarking on the only walking safari in polar bear territory might include a sense of both awe and 'awww' – these captivating creatures are simultaneously fierce and fetching! No two experiences are exactly alike in this remote wilderness on the edge of the Arctic, each day dictated by weather and

wildlife movement, and each night an opportunity to bathe in the enchanting, electric blaze of the aurora borealis, which appears here 300 days per year.

## Pugdundee Safaris, Central India

Tread lightly throughout the rugged terrain of Satpura Tiger Reserve on a trip with Central India's pioneers of walking safaris. But stay alert; although this is a lesser-known park and the hike through the jungle can be meditative, you're walking in the wild and Satpura is home to tigers, leopards, wild boar, crocodiles, bison, sloth bears and more. If you prefer solid walls rather than swag camps at night, you can opt instead



for one of Pugdundee's eco-lodge-based safaris.
