A proficient trapper of wolves and other canids, he has expertise in catching, anesthetizing, and radio-collaring wild animals. In 2011, he was one of the specialists involved in the reintroduction of Gaur from Kanha to Bandhavgarh. Kartikeya is also a specialist trainer who regularly conducts training for frontline forest department staff, guides, and naturalists.

With over 18 years of experience as a senior Naturalist in Southern & Central India, David Raju has always been interested in wildlife and with specific interest and expertise in multiple taxa like Birds, Mammals, Butterflies, Reptiles, Amphibians and his first love Dragonflies.

David has co-authored three books - "Dragonflies of kerala" A photographic field guide to wildlife of Central India & 'Wildlife of South India'. He was part of the team that discovered 12 species of frogs and two species of geckos in Central India & the Western Ghats. He was conferred the prestigious Lodge Naturalist of the Year Award by Sanctuary Asia and Toft in 2014. Recently a wasp (*Tiphia davidrajui*) has been named after him for his contribution to natural history and dragonflies.

He has spearheaded effective conservation projects across India and has been a recipient of several awards for nature conservation. We also invite Experts from Forest Department, NGOs, pioneers in the field to interact with the students and share their experiences and practical challenges they face in wildlife and conservation.

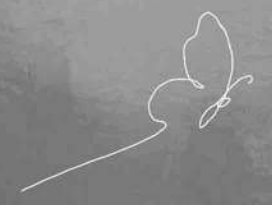


What will you learn?

AMBHIBIANS AND REPTILES

A combination of indoor presentations & outdoor walks to search and witness the behaviour of amphibians & reptiles.

Sessions on behavior , characteristics and process of identification



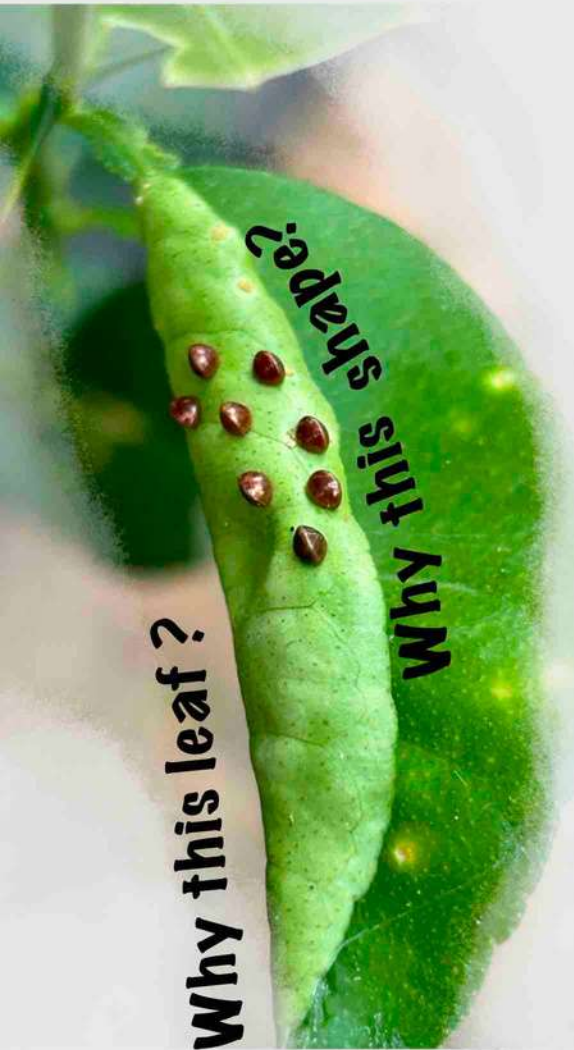
Follow the croaking sound in the night into a water filled field !

Learn about the difference between moth and butterflies and basics of few commonly sighted insects.

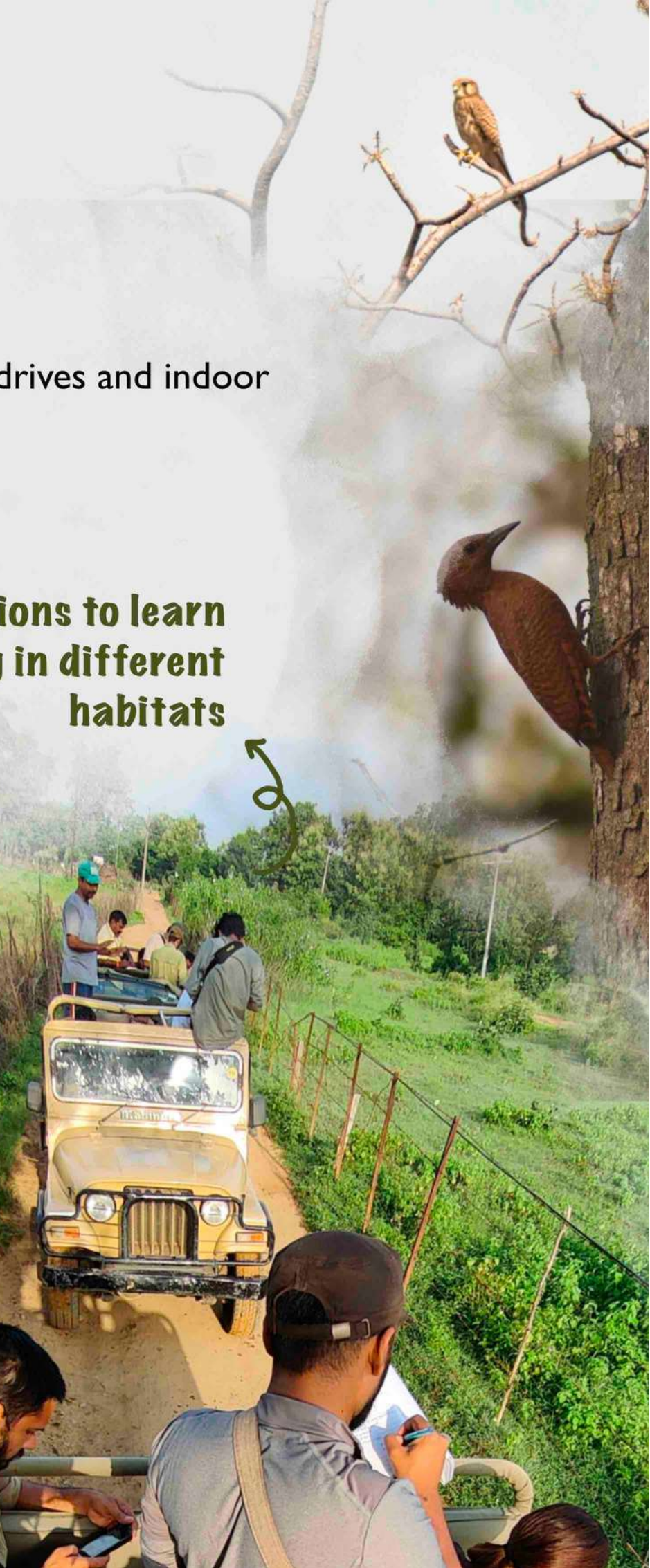
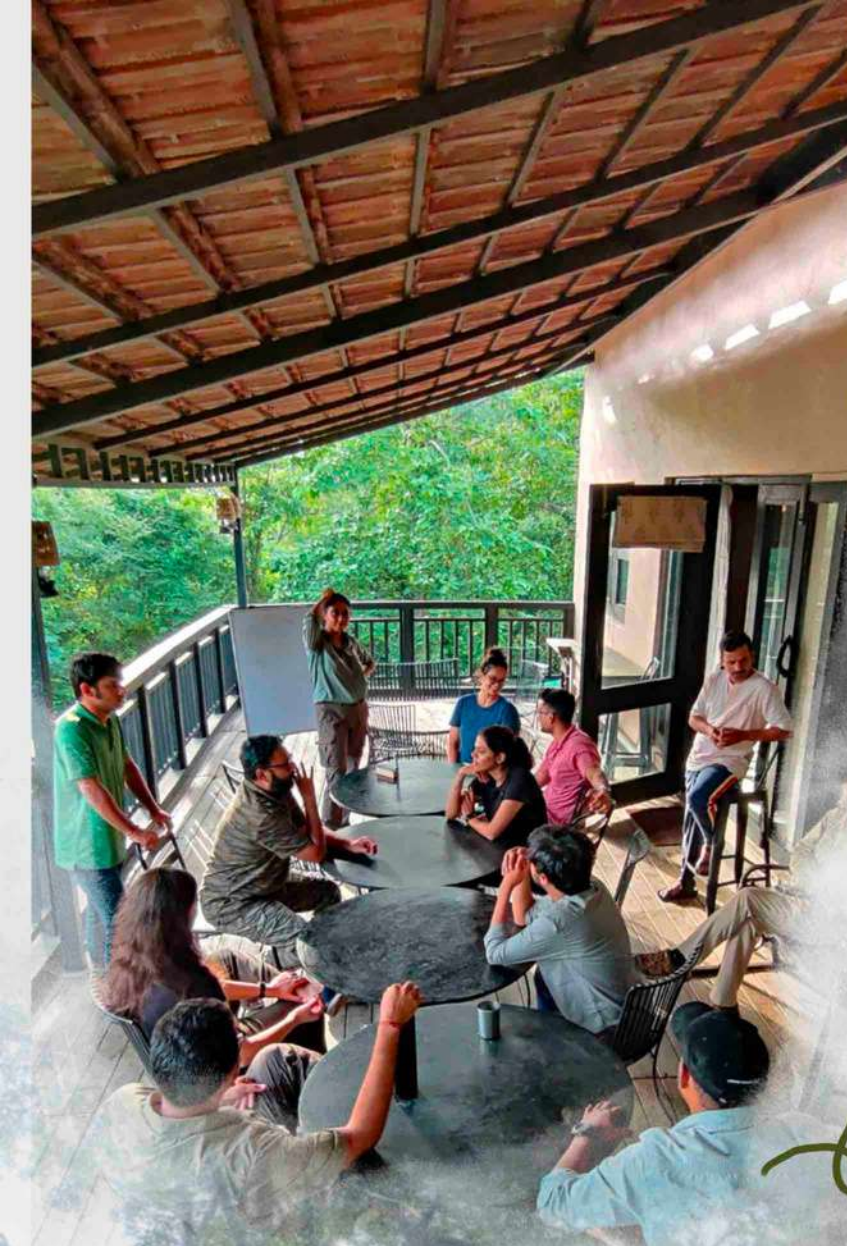
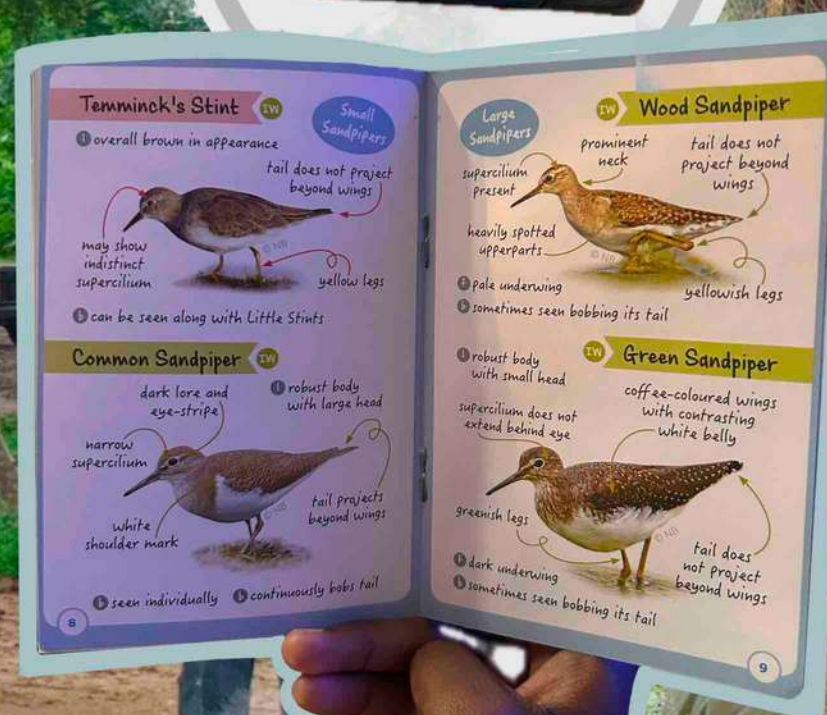
BIRDS

Field sessions to learn birding in different habitats



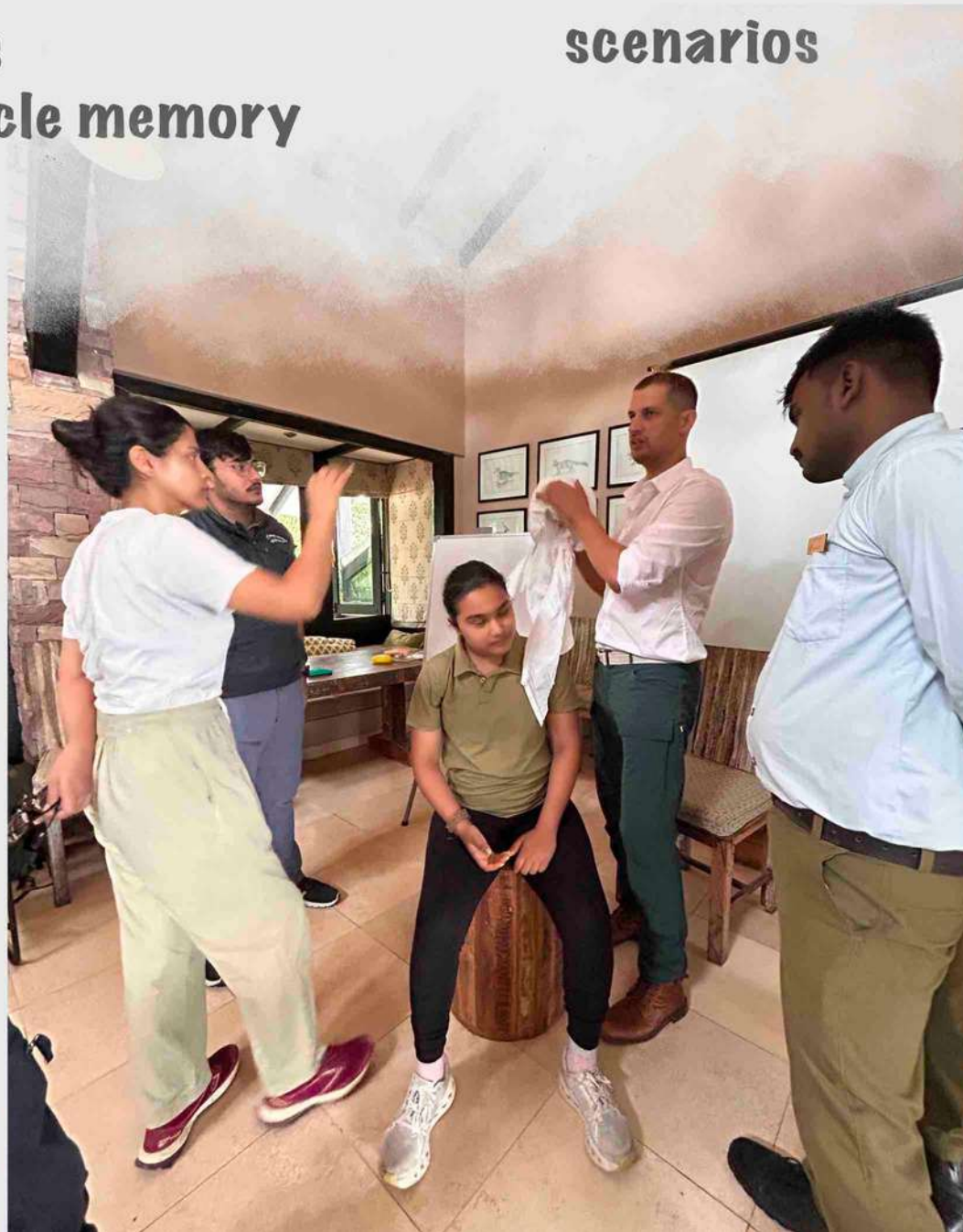
FIRST AID

This 4 day session aims to train the students with basic first aid techniques by giving them different kinds of scenarios and by making them practice.

End of the sessions, practical and theoretical exams are conducted based on which the students will be certified as a First aider, certificate of which will be valid for 2 years.

GUIDING TECHNIQUES

(Covered in Extension)

Naturalists & nature guides are someone who are like a bridge between wildlife/nature/jungle & the guests. They make the walks and safaris more entertaining & educational.

They point out to the things which may otherwise go unnoticed and give a unique perspective to it. In simple words they make the guests fall in love with the jungle.

As much as the job sounds fascinating, being a good naturalist is a skill and it is a challenging job.

Our 3 days extension course on guiding aims to equip the participants with those techniques which are used in the field to guide the guests on walks and safaris and how to present all the stories and information learnt in a entertaining way to the guests.

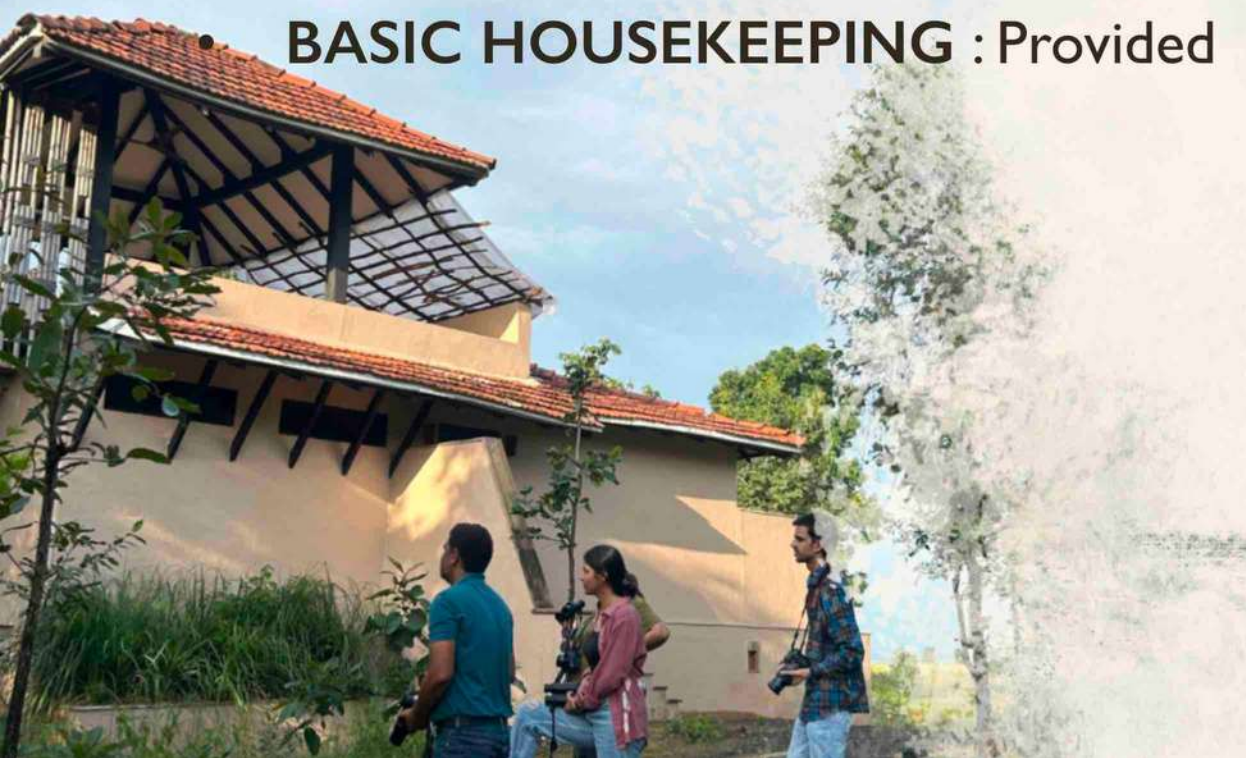

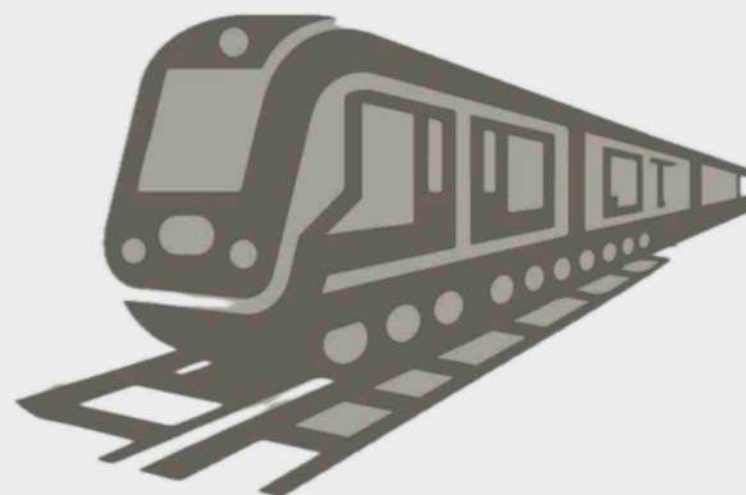
How to reach the campus ?

- Candidates joining the course are expected to abide by the PRONAT rules and regulations.
- Candidates are expected to thoroughly read the consent form given on arrival and acknowledge the same with the date and signatures.

- Candidates joining PRONAT should be in the age group of 18-45 & are required to sign an indemnity bond before commencing the course.

COURSE FEE

Main course (21 nights / 22 days)

- On triple sharing : INR 1,15,000 + plus 5% GST per person
- Single rooms can be booked at the supplement of INR 65000 + plus 5% GST

Extension (03 nights / 04 days) for additional modules

- On triple sharing : INR 24,500 + plus 5% GST per person
- Single rooms can be booked at the supplement of INR 20,000 + plus 5% GST
